Resolution No. 51-2008 Tax Exemption for Permanently Disabled Veteran

Motion by Mr. Post, seconded by Ms. Schriver and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote, the Township Committee adopted Resolution No. 51-2008. (As written below)

RESOLUTION NO. 51-2008 TOWNSHIP OF LEBANON COUNTY OF HUNTERDON STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS the Tax Collector of Lebanon Township has been shown proof and in accordance with the Tax Assessor ascertains that George J. Ginda, owner of Block 24, lot 5.04, 36 Hickory Run Road in the Township of Lebanon, is totally and permanently disabled as a result of service to the United States, and has been so declared by the Veteran's Administration, and.

WHEREAS in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54: 4-3.32, the governing body of any municipality may refund the amount of taxes collected on any property which would have been exempt from taxation if proper claim in writing had been timely made, and,

WHEREAS Mr. Ginda has been declared totally and permanently disabled since December 5th 2007, and had only received such notification on March 27th 2008 from the Department of Veteran's Affairs,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Lebanon, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that Mr. Ginda's property be exempted from all property taxes from the date of his total and permanent disability December

5th 2007, and that the \$3,318.99 which has been paid in taxes since December 5th 2007 be returned to Mr. Ginda and,

BE IT FURTHERMORE RESOLVED that the property be tax exempt as long as it is owned and occupied by George J. Ginda or by his surviving spouse in accordance with the continuance of the right to exemption.

Resolution No. 52-2008 – Award Library Roof Bid

Discussion was held on the awarding of the Bunnvale Library Roof. Attorney Bernstein stated that there were concerns with the consent surety bond submitted by the lowest bidder. It is a non-material issue. Attorney Bernstein explained the differences with the bonds. Mayor Piazza wanted to know the difference in the amount of the bids. Attorney Bernstein stated that Glenn

Roofing LLC was \$29,675.00 and D. A. Nolt's bid was in the amount of \$47,936.00. These were the only two bids submitted.

Motion by Mr. Post, seconded by Ms. Schriver and carried by favorable roll call vote, the Township Committee award the project to Glenn Roofing for the price of \$29,675.00 conditioned on the approval of capitol funding subject to certification of available funds by the CFO and amount not to exceed \$29,675.00 and the requirement of a performance bond. There are approximately 140 riders. Police Chief Chris Mattson and DPW Supervisor Paul Jones are to be notified of the event.

Motion by Mr. Post, seconded by Ms. Schriver and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote, the Township Committee approved the "Braking the Cycle" bike tour which will travel through a portion of the township.

Lebanon Township Historian's Meeting Minutes for April 3, 2008. A letter from Nancy Dontzin was included with the minutes (Her husband, Ben Dontzin, had been a Historian). Attorney Bernstein requested the name and address of the pastor for the Spruce Run Lutheran Church as Mrs. Dontzin thought that the church may own the Swak Church property.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Motion by Ms. Schriver, seconded by Mr. Post and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote, the Township Committee opened the Public Comment portion of the meeting.

Jay Harkins, Lebanon Township Fire Chief, discussed with the Committee that he would like the option of re-purposing the money from last year's capital ordinance that was not used, for the purpose of purchasing a Brush Truck. Originally the ordinance was for the purchase of a UTV, which is now being given to the Fire Company by the County. A stipulation with the County is

that there is to be 2 vehicles able to tow the UTV for mutual aid. At this time, the Fire Company does have one vehicle that can be used to tow the UTV and would like the brush truck as the second vehicle.

Warren Gabriel stated that a township truck or police vehicle could also be used.

Motion by Mr. Post, seconded by Ms. Schriver and carried by unanimous favorable roll call vote, the Township Committee closed the Public Comment portion of the meeting.

There was a discussion relative to the possible acquisition of property relative to the use for municipal purposes. Mr. Jones will be present at the next meeting to discuss the matter. No action taken. The Governing Body reviewed the opposed Memorandum of Agreement between the Township of Lebanon and the CWA Local 1040 and

the proposed changes submitted by the Union. The Township has authorized the Township Attorney to re-draft the Memorandum of Agreement to take into account those items they can accept versus not. No formal action needed to be take.
