

New Valley View Playground Open for Play

After years of fundraising and development by the Lebanon Township community, the new Valley View Elementary School playground is open for students to enjoy during recess. When students returned from spring break, physical education teacher, Janice Gross, gave each of her classes an introduction to the individual pieces of equipment on the playground and reviewed appropriate and safe ways to use each one. When the orientation was complete, students began using the new playground daily at recess, to rave reviews.

The playground features an area designed especially for Valley View's preschool students which includes a climbing structure complete with slides, swings, a jeep ready for make-believe road trips or a run to the store, and a playhouse. It also includes a large section designed for the school-age children which includes a climbing structure featuring a suspension bridge and tunnel slides, swings, and the students' favorite: a climbing structure which includes a three-person "spinner." Adjacent to the playground is a new blacktop/basketball court which includes six basketball standards and plenty of room to enjoy a friendly game of basketball or brush up on shooting skills. The centerpiece of the playground is a beautiful gazebo offering a respite from the sun. The gazebo was built by local carpenters – and fathers of students – Joe Albore and Mike Brogan.

The playground was designed by Designed for Fun, Inc. of Pennsylvania and was a gift to the students of Valley View from the Lebanon Township Education Foundation. The foundation is a non-profit organization established to promote education for all members of the Lebanon Township community. It oversaw the effort to bring a new playground to Valley View by raising the funds necessary to develop plans, conduct site work, purchase equipment, and install the playground. Funding for the project did not come from tax-dollars. Instead, it was provided by local benefactors, parent donations, local business support, and the proceeds of various fundraisers like flower sales, bake sales, and events.

Installation of the playground equipment began in November with the support of Barkman Excavation and an all-volunteer installation crew comprised of parents and grandparents, older siblings of Valley View students, friends and co-workers of parents, and school staff and administration. Mike Walsh, president of the Lebanon Township Education Foundation offered, "The playground provides a great outlet for the students. It helps them challenge their minds and bodies and develop great social skills. It is also a visible reminder of the types of things we can accomplish – without the need for tax dollars -- when we work together as a community."

*A Look back at our Heritage ...

WPA SHOVEL - 1938 MODEL



A reader has supplied the above photograph, said to be the authentic reproduction of a new kind of shovel invented by a Philadelphia man for use of WPA "workers". As one may see at a glance, the shovel has certain very decided advantages over the old pre-New Deal type, which is utilized to support the back and make it easier to carry the shovel from one shady spot to another, or to move it in cold weather if the "worker" is forced to change his position when the wind blows smoke in his eyes. The article is said not to be patented. It consists of a discarded motor car seat, clamped to a pre-depression model shovel. The Hunterdon County Board of Freeholders now has under advisement a proposal to re-adopt the old-fashioned shovel as the official shovel of the County of Hunterdon, after a two month delay due to a plan by WPA to take over the 1938 highway building and improvement program.

(Note: The Works Progress Administration (WPA) was the largest New Deal agency, employing millions to carry out public works projects, including the construction of public buildings and roads, and operated large arts, drama, media, and literacy projects.)

Ellen Doran Honored by Kean University

Our community was deeply saddened twice in just over a year; first, with the passing of Mike Doran in the spring of 2008, and then again in the summer of 2009 with the loss of his wife, Ellen. During that time, Ellen had been working towards her Masters Degree in Speech-Language Pathology, a milestone she never had a chance to achieve. An incredible honor and tribute has been bestowed in memory of Ellen Doran. The Community of Kean University has announced they will be awarding Ellen her Master's Degree posthumously in Speech-Language Pathology.

Update from the Lebanon Township Education Foundation ...

After Ellen's passing, so many community members and friends of the Doran Family were looking for a way to help Mike and Ellen's three young children. The LTEF was able to provide a temporary outlet for this need by holding monetary contributions until a formal trust could be established for the children. The LTEF has received more than \$22,000 in contributions, which will be donated directly to the Doran Children Trust for John, Kevin and Matthew's futures. These funds have come from individual donations, as well as from several fundraisers held both within and outside the township. I would like to share a few examples of the amazing efforts people have made to help a family in need.

When the LTEF learned of Ellen's Masters Degree, our organization also received a \$700 check from one of Ellen's professors and a group of her fellow students. These funds, raised through a bake sale at Kean University, were sent to us as a donation to the Doran Children Trust.

Last summer, Terri Kuo's children and their friends decided to run a lemonade stand. At the end of the summer, the children donated all the proceeds from their summer lemonade stand, totaling \$250.00, to the Doran Children Trust. Our thanks go out to the children of the Kuo, Toth, Trudel and Woodell Families.

Karen and Edward Verso, proprietors of the Repertory Dance Company, were also touched by the loss of Mike and Ellen and wanted to help the children. They graciously dedicated a performance of *The Nutcracker* to the Doran Family, and donated \$1,200 from one of the holiday shows to the Doran Children Trust.

Lilly and Brielle Barozzini, with assistance from their mother Kelly, decided on a fundraiser for the boys. The girls debuted their uniquely designed headbands in their new business venture *Cha Cha Designs* with an open house at their Lebanon Township home last fall, and had a wonderful turn out. Lilly and Brielle donated the proceeds from that day to the Doran

Children Trust.

When Ellen became ill, Karen Morrow and several close friends established a community link through the website *Lotsa Helping Hands, Ellen's Friends*, which provided meals, groceries and household chores for Ellen. After Ellen's passing, the site continued to organize needs for the family and assisted in helping Kevin, John and Matthew get ready for "back to school" in their new home.

There have been countless gestures of compassion and contributions for the family, many more than can be listed here. The Doran/Infante family has felt an outpouring of kindness during this difficult time, and words cannot truly express their gratitude. Annemarie Infante, Ellen's sister, and her husband, Sam, have doubled the number of children under their roof, and doubled their love. Annemarie and Sam have asked me to pass on how extremely grateful they are for all the support, kindness, love and friendship they have received. This outpouring of continued support has been incredible, not just from our township, but from everyone who was touched by Mike and Ellen.
