KEEPING IT GREEN & GROWING: USING AIRPLANES TO IMPROVE SOIL HEALTH IN NEW JERSEY

During late August or early September, a low-flying plane will blanket 1,000 acres of northern and central NJ cropland in cover crops; an all-natural mixture of rye and clover seeds. However, farmers won't be harvesting this crop in the spring; its purpose is to build resilience and prevent soil erosion.

Cover crops are being embraced by farmers. They help farmers by improving soil - increasing organic matter of the soil while also improving water infiltration rates, water holding capacity and downstream water quality.

"Many farmers believe the use of cover crops is a no-brainer for building resilience to the droughts and deluges common today" -Laura Tessieri, Executive Director of North Jersey RC&D.

The aerial seeding program is in its 10th year and is the result of a partnership between USDA Natural Resources
Conservation Service (NRCS) and nonprofit North Jersey RC&D. North Jersey RC&D coordinates with local farmers as well as plane and seed companies to achieve cost savings from bulk purchasing.

Experienced pilots will perform the seeding using an air tractor, a fixed-wing aircraft designed for the purpose of seeding. No pesticides or fertilizers are applied during this operation.

The seeds will grow under the dense corn and soy cover. When the grains and beans are harvested, the newly established cover crops will remain, protecting the soil from erosion throughout the winter. In the spring, the lush cover crops will provide additional soil nitrogen, build organic matter and suppress weeds.



The 2023 seed mix includes cereal rye, annual rye grass and crimson clover -- all non-GMO seed. The clover species in the mix are chosen to promote nitrogen fixation and the rye is hardy and provides rapid, dense coverage.

Identification of fields to be seeded is done in advance so that flight paths can be established and seeding of nearby farms can be coordinated. Weather conditions and temporary flight restrictions influence seeding dates.

North Jersey Resource Conservation & Development (RC&D) is a regional nonprofit organization serving Hunterdon, Morris, Somerset, Sussex, Union and Warren Counties in New Jersey. Through partnerships with municipal, state and federal agencies, as well as many private entities, the North Jersey RC&D Council develops and manages programs and projects that promote the conservation and improvement of the region's resources.

NEW FUNDING AVAILABLE TO PURCHASE OPEN SPACE!

Lebanon Township has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$350,000 from Green Acres. This money can be used, along with the Township's Open Space Trust Fund, Hunterdon County's Open Space program, NJ Water Supply Authority and partnerships with nonprofit organizations like The Hunterdon Land Trust, to purchase more land for open space in Lebanon Township.

Why preserve open space in Lebanon Township?

- Open space protects and maintains the prevailing rural character and unique sense of place of the township, including scenic landscapes, which result from the natural topography, agricultural lands, woodlands and watercourses.
- Open space protects water quality, reduces runoff, and helps to build up (recharge) our groundwater supply.
- Open space provides more outdoor recreation, which includes fishing access, hiking, wildlife watching and in some areas deer hunting (with a township permit).

In order to be considered for open space acquisition, properties must either have never been developed or have been returned to its natural state. The township can purchase complete lots or carve off a section for open space to leave the owner with their house and other buildings.

Priorities for acquisition are based on expansion of existing preserves, passive recreation opportunities for hiking and fishing, and the environmental sensitivity of land for wildlife habitat, with particular attention given to preserving clean and healthy streams and groundwater recharge.






HISTORIAN COMMITTEE

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS! This fall marks the anniversary of Happy Face Nursery School, a time of celebration and a time of remembering.

In 1972, a group of local women recognized the need for a nursery school in the community, the closest one being in Washington. Devoted to providing their young children with an early education, these like-minded parents spent a year planning, learning, and gathering all the information they could. They were: Pat Brownell, Judy Eckwielen, Anne Cooley, Ingrid Kegg, Karen Rich, Eleanor Rich and Dot Rauschenberger. Each of the ladies took on a different task and with help from a local lawyer and the community, Happy Face Nursery School opened its doors a year later in 1973. Here is a class photo from the '73-'74 school year.



Long time Lebanon Township resident and teacher Valerie Shlimbaum worked at Happy Face for 25 years, 22 of which as Director. She lovingly recalls, "Seeing those adorable little faces walk through the door every morning and having the opportunity to provide these children the best possible first early learning environment was the most rewarding teaching experience I can imagine."

A Hunterdon County Democrat article from

March 29, 1973 advertised the school offered a two day session for \$20 a month and a three day a week program for \$28 a month. A five day program was later added at \$45 per month. The first Director was Eleanor Rich of Lebanon Township and the head teacher Gwynn Olbrick of Clinton Township. The school board filed for state accreditation as an incorporated, independent, non-profit organization. These 50 years of excellence in early childhood education have poised the school for success as they embrace the evolving needs of the community.

Current educator Donna McDede, who has been teaching at Happy Face for 22 years fondly states, "Teaching at Happy Face is being part of a family and nothing short of an honor. My hope is to make even the tiniest difference in the lives of my students. To be their teacher is not only inspiring but the best job in the world!"

Kudos to the group of women who took a chance 50 years ago to make a positive change and impact in their community. Their vision and aspirations live on today, along with the memories hundreds of children possess of their first school days.

In honor of the 50th anniversary, a major renovation of the playground is planned.

Milestones. Once a bustling center of industry, an appreciation for the arts has also always been an integral part of New Hampton's spirit. Our current exhibit celebrates the village's 25th anniversary of being included on the National Register of Historic Places by sharing the history of the hamlet but also the effort of neighbors to realize this goal. Highlighted are previously untold stories, remarkable residents, and amazing artisans of the locale, from both then and now.

Visitors have been awed by the fine arts and crafts made by current New Hampton residents on display in this exhibit.

However, the real showpiece must be the Prall wedding dress pictured here.

In 1830, John Prall opened a furniture factory in New Hampton. It was said that there wasn't "a homestead in all this vicinity which has not in it some of Prall's furniture." On February 6, 1873, his twenty-one-year-old daughter Hattie married local farmer and merchant George Creveling Apgar.

Her wedding dress, donated by her descendants, Lebanon Township residents Josh and Karen Rich, has enthralled visitors for the past two months. Don't worry, there's still time to see the Prall dress and the rest of Historic New Hampton through the end of September.



Glass bottles and jars: Food and beverage container glass with rings and caps removed will be accepted. All containers MUST be emptied and rinsed. Cups, drinking glasses, dishes, ovenware, window glass, lead crystal, TV tubes, light bulbs, mirrors or any other type of glass product WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Hard covered books & Paperback books

Junk mail & office paper: Un-shredded junk mail and office paper will be accepted. Junk mail and office paper should be tied or placed in a cardboard container (box). Shredded or bagged junk mail and office paper WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Newspaper: Newspaper tied with string or twine will be accepted. Newspaper bound in tape or other materials WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Plastics bottles # 1-7: Plastic bottles # 1-7 that originally contained liquids are accepted. All containers MUST be emptied and rinsed.

Telephone books

Tin and bi-metal cans: Are accepted if all food and other residue have been removed. Labels do not have to be removed.
